A. International Meetings attended by MCA representatives

The 12th Electronic Communications Committee Working Group Numbering and Networks Meeting

An MCA representative participated in the 12th Electronic Communications Committee Working Group Numbering and Networks Meeting, which was held on the 27th and 28th April 2016 in Jūrmala, Latvia. During this meeting, various presentations were delivered to provide an overview of the work related to current and future numbering issues which were carried out during the past six months by different project teams reporting to this working group. An external session focusing on numbering for M2M/IoT was also held with presentations from various industry stakeholders.

Ovum's 5th Annual Smart to Future Cities & Urban IoT 2017

A representative of the MCA participated in the Ovum's 5th Annual Smart to Future Cities & Urban IoT 2017, which was held between the 25th and 27th April 2016 in London, UK. It focused on best practices in the development of smart cities, particularly cities leveraging on communications technologies like Internet of Things. The conference was spread over two days and had two simultaneous tracks on both days. A parallel, startup exhibition was also held but this was limited to around 8 startups.

The 1st Horizon 2020 Future Internet Forum

An MCA representative attended the 1st Horizon 2020 Future Internet Forum, which was held between the 20th and the 21st April 2016 in Brussels, Belgium. The objective of this forum was to facilitate exchange of information, sharing of good practices, facilitation of coordination, and integration of relevant activities in the area of Future Internet in the Member and Associated States.

The forum focused:

- on research and development
- on reinforcing innovation
- on promoting take-up in the area of Future Internet

During the first meeting the domains of Communication Network Technologies (and in particular 5G); Internet of Things and Cloud-based services and infrastructures were discussed.

BeSmartOnline! – Insafe Training Meeting and Steering Committee Meeting

A representative of the MCA attended the 'BeSmartOnline! – Insafe Training Meeting and Steering Committee Meeting' hosted by the European Network for Safer Internet Centres across Europe between the 20th and 22nd April in Larnaca, Cyprus, which centred around the themes of privacy and gaming.

Connecting the Internal Market through Modern Regulation

An MCA representative together with other Government officials attended a High-level meeting 'Connecting the Internal Market through Modern Regulation'. The meeting was hosted on the 19th and 20th April 2016, by the current presidency of the Council of the E.U. for Government representatives in Amsterdam, Netherlands, to discuss the upcoming review of the Electronic Communications Framework - a set of laws establishing the rules of the sector.

BEREC General Meetings – Session 4

An MCA representative attended the BEREC General Meetings – Session 4 between the 19th and 21st April 2016 in Brussels, Belgium. Apart from an overview of Session 3 the remaining of the session dealt with Spectrum Policy, the concept of the USO, the issue of Consumer and Data Protection, Competition Policy and the Concept of Copyright.

Regulatory Meeting on Postal Statistics

An MCA representative attended the Regulatory Meeting on Postal Statistics on the 19th April 2016 in Brussels, Belgium. This is a yearly meeting in which the various NRAs together with the Commission meet to discuss the development of Postal Statistics. During the meeting the challenges in relation to parcel data were discussed due to recent developments of eCommerce.

European Consumer and Competition Day

A representative of the MCA attended the 'European Consumer and Competition Day Conference' hosted by the Netherlands presidency on the 18th of April 2016 in Amsterdam. The conference discussed the rise of online platforms and their impact on the economic and societal aspect of our lives and the challenges that these advances present from a policy perspective. It also discussed the current competition and consumer protection laws and analysed whether these are adequate to address current competition issues and protect consumers' interests.

MEA EWG Drafters Meeting

An MCA representative attended the MEA EWG Drafters Meeting which was held between the 13th and 15th April 2016 in Barcelona, Spain. The BEREC's Market and Economic Analysis Working Group (MEA EWG) was tasked to draft a follow-up document to BEREC's report on Oligopoly Analysis and Regulation, in the context of the forthcoming review of the Framework and the SMP Guidelines. This document will serve as a reference to the Commission on matters concerning the assessment and regulation of tight oligopolies. The meeting's agenda included 2 other items, the 2017 Work Program of the MEA EWG and the study on post-mergers and acquisitions earmarked for completion this year.

BEREC's Expert Working Group Meeting

A representative of the MCA participated to a BEREC's Expert Working Group meeting held in Hague on the 13th April 2016, where the Draft BEREC Guidelines on the Implementation by National Regulators of European Net Neutrality Rules were discussed in detail.

ITU-EC Regional Conference for Europe on "Broadband Services and Infrastructure Mapping"

An MCA representative attended the ITU-EC Regional Conference for Europe on "Broadband Services and Infrastructure Mapping", held in Warsaw between the 11th and 12th April 2016. The conference discussed the various considerations involved in setting up broadband and infrastructure maps, and their benefit to all stakeholders.

Pending lawsuits:

- 4th April: Vodafone vs MCA – re contestation of MCA MTR decision of 2014 before the Administrative Review Tribunal. Continuation of evidence by parties. Stands adjourned to 17th May 2016 – final submissions by Vodafone
- 4th April: Vodafone vs MCA before the Administrative Review Tribunal – appeal contesting MCA’s decision relating to retail market access whether GO are no longer considered to be dominant. Case adjourned for 17th May 2016 – for MCA’s evidence
- 4th April: Melita vs MCA before the Administrative Review Tribunal – appeal contesting MCA’s decision relating to retail market access whether GO are no longer considered to be dominant. Case adjourned for 17th May 2016 for MCA’s evidence.
- 4th April: Melita vs MCA before the Administrative Review Tribunal – contesting MCA’s directory enquiry services decision. Case stands adjourned for closure of MCA’s evidence and submission of Melita’s final submissions.

Engadget *FCC expands Lifeline to help low-income Americans afford Internet*

The FCC has voted 3-2 to approve expanding its Lifeline program that has subsidised phone and prepaid wireless access for low-income Americans since the 80s, so that now it covers internet access too [[read more](#)].

NPR *FCC votes to propose new Privacy Rules for Internet Service Providers*

The Federal Communications Commission is officially proposing to begin regulating how Internet service providers handle user privacy. The agency is looking to restrict the companies' ability to share with advertisers and other third parties the information they collect about what their customers do online [[read more](#)].

Ofcom *Ofcom consults on designing the Broadband Universal Service obligation*

In November 2015, the UK Government set out its intention to introduce a broadband universal service obligation (USO). This would give everyone a right to a decent broadband connection on request. The Government proposed introducing this universal service obligation in recognition of the increasingly important role broadband plays in people's lives [[read more](#)].

European Council *Data Protection reform*

The data protection reform is a legislative package proposed by the Commission in 2012 to update and modernise the rules of the 1995 data protection directive and the 2008 framework decision on data protection in judicial cooperation in criminal matters and police cooperation. Uniform and up-to-date legislation on data protection is essential to guarantee the fundamental right of individuals to have their personal data protected, to allow for the development of the digital economy and to strengthen the fight against crime and terrorism [[read more](#)].
