### CNMC sets a Lower Mobile Call Origination Charge in Calls to Freephone Numbers

The Spanish regulator, CNMC, solved a dispute between Dialoga (an operator of value-added services) and Telefónica Móviles setting a lower origination charge for mobile calls to Dialoga's freephone numbers (including short numbers and freephone information (900/800) numbers). ## New Laws to increase Mobile Coverage and accelerate the Roll-out of 5G

The UK government is preparing a reform of planning laws aimed at increasing 4G coverage in rural areas and accelerating 5G roll-out. According to the government, the planned law changes (e.g. allowing taller and wider masts) will reduce the need for new phone masts and will boost the signal on roads.
