## Italy - Public Payphones removed from Universal Service Obligations

Following a public consultation, the Italian telecoms regulator, AGCOM, deemed no longer necessary to continue to guarantee the availability of public payphones under the universal service obligations. **Cullen International** (read more – subscription required)

# ARCEP consults on the WACC applicable from 2024

The electronic communications regulator, ARCEP, estimated the nominal pre-tax WACC, applicable to all cost-oriented fixed wholesale services, at between 4.2% and 6.9%. WACC has been set at 4.8% since 2021. **Cullen International** (read more – subscription required)

#### ITU says WRC-27 Agenda Item needed for Satellite reuse of Spectrum

The ITU has re-iterated its concern that some commercial plans from existing satellite direct-to-device (D2D) deployments may not be allowed under international rules. These include plans from Lynk, AST SpaceMobile and Starlink.
