DEVELOPMENTS IN ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATIONS NETWORK AND SERVICES

ANCOM proposes new Rules for Spectrum Sharing

The electronic communications regulator, ANCOM, proposed to revise conditions and the approval procedure for spectrum sharing. Spectrum sharing would only be implemented in mobile spectrum bands (from 700 MHz to 26 GHz) provided that there is no more radio spectrum available and the proposed sharing will not affect competition. **Cullen International** (read more – subscription required)

ARCEP (France) adopts a New Postal Price Cap for the Period 2024–2025

ARCEP and La Poste have agreed on a new pricing framework for 2024–2025.
