But a concept under development in recent years focusses on establishing an acceptable amount of interference that receivers have to live with. This "harm claim threshold" (or interference limit) is intended to clarify the relationship between different users of spectrum by defining the level of interference that might trigger a legitimate complaint from an interfered-with spectrum user.
