Google Cloud: 'Telcos are at a Crossroads'

Last month Deutsche Telekom and Google Cloud teamed up to develop a network Al agent they claimed will improve RAN operations, called the RAN Guardian agent. **Telecom.com** (read more)

PostNord to cease handling Letters in Denmark

PostNord, previously the postal universal service provider in Denmark, has decided to stop handling letters after 30th December 2025. PostNord will also take down all of its current 1,500 mailboxes around the country and will stop selling postage stamps. **Post & Parcel (read more)**
