Polish Regulator proposes to deregulate Fixed Broadband

The Polish regulator UKE is consulting until 16th August 2025 on the deregulation of the wholesale markets for local access at a fixed location (WLA, market 1/2020) and central access for mass market products (WCA, market 3b/2014). **Cullen International** (read more – subscription required)

UK consults on the Future of the Post Office

The UK government is considering possible changes to the current requirements applicable to the size and shape of the Post Office network.
