New Zealand Mobile Operator launches Satellite Direct-to-Device with Starlink

One NZ has launched its satellite direct-to-device (D2D) service in partnership with Starlink. The service will be provided to existing customers at no extra cost, allowing them to send text messages by satellite when no terrestrial coverage is available. **Policy Tracker** (read more – subscription required)
