Malta actively helped shape New EU Rules that Protect Children Online

The Malta Communications Authority (MCA), as Malta's Digital Services Coordinator, contributed directly to the drafting of new EU guidelines under the DSA. These guidelines set out what Very Large Online Platforms (VLOPs), must do to assess and reduce the risks their services pose to minors.



Locally, this work is complemented by initiatives like BeSmartOnline! demonstrating how Malta is assisting in creating a digital environment where children's rights and well-being are a priority. This means the platforms many of us use every day must be more responsible in protecting children online and making the internet a safer place for everyone.
