## **Meeting with Meta**

The MCA's Digital Services Team met with Meta on 30<sup>th</sup> May 2025, in order to discuss Facebook content moderation affecting Maltese social media users. Both sides agreed to maintain open communication and to follow up if similar issues arise.

## 42<sup>nd</sup> Meeting of the ECC Working Group NaN2

Two representatives from the MCA participated virtually, in a meeting of a project team within WG NaN which was held between the 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> May 2025. The project team held discussions on multiple aspects related to trust in numbers, number portability, and switching, including ongoing Report drafting and discussions on future work items.

## 11<sup>th</sup> Meeting of Working Group 3 of the European Board of Digital Services

On 28<sup>th</sup> May 2025, the MCA participated in the 11<sup>th</sup> online meeting of WG 3 on Content Moderation and Data Access. The session focused on the Trusted Flagger Guidelines, with DG CONNECT presenting the current state of play, timeline, and an outline of the Guidelines. Discussions covered the criteria for awarding trusted flagger status, as well as procedures for its suspension and revocation.

## Ad hoc European Board for Digital Services Meeting

The MCA took part in an ad hoc European Board for Digital Services held online, on the 26<sup>th</sup> May 2025. The meeting focused on a proposed joint EC–Board action on protecting minors from adult content and the Commission's preliminary findings sent to TikTok (15<sup>th</sup> May).

## **DSA Training**

Personnel from IMD and ER attended in-person training, organised by DG CONNECT and designed for Digital Services Coordinators (DSCs), between the 21<sup>st</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup> May 2025. The purpose of this training was to ensure that all DSCs have the necessary tools to effectively enforce the Digital Services Act (DSA), and to become familiar both with the legislation and with their peers.

The programme started with an introduction to the Regulation, covering its scope, liability and content moderation, risk management and the protection of minors, amongst others. IMD staff then joined for the advanced sessions covering, amongst others, orders, ODS bodies, DSA complaints management and access to data.

## Ad-hoc Working Group 2 of the European Board of Digital Services Meeting

The MCA participated in an ad-hoc joint meeting of WG2 – Working Together and WG6 – Protection of Minors, on the 21<sup>st</sup> May 2025. The meeting focused on discussions surrounding a potential joint press statement on coordinated action concerning Article 28 DSA.

## 2<sup>nd</sup> BEREC Contact Network (CN)

The MCA participated in the second BEREC CN meeting of the year, held on the 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> May 2025 in Lisbon and hosted by ANACOM. The meeting aimed to prepare for the 63<sup>rd</sup> ordinary plenary sessions of the BEREC Board of Regulators) and the BEREC Office Management Board, scheduled for the 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> June 2025 in Iceland.

## 61<sup>st</sup> Meeting of the ECC Working Group NaN1

Two representatives from the MCA participated virtually, in a meeting of a project team within WG NaN which was held between the 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> May, 2025. The project team held discussions on multiple aspects related to future numbering issues, including ongoing drafting of Reports, reviewing of ECC Recommendations and discussions on future

work items.

### Workshop in Brussels on Risk Assessments under the DSA

The MCA attended an in-person workshop in Brussels, on the 7<sup>th</sup> May 2025, focused on risk assessments under the Digital Services Act (DSA). Organised by the European Commission, the event brought together VLOPs, VLOSEs, Digital Services Coordinators, civil society, and academia to discuss the identification and mitigation of systemic risks.

The workshop featured sessions on key topics such as illegal content, disinformation, elections, protection of minors, mental health, and consumer protection, contributing to the upcoming Article 35(2) report on systemic risks.

## BEREC Planning and Future Trends (PFT) Expert Working Group Meeting

MCA attended the full Expert Working Group (EWG) meeting held at the IRG Secretariat in Brussels on the 7<sup>th</sup> May 2025, which was dedicated to drafting the BEREC Mid-Term Strategy 2026-2030. The draft will be presented to the BEREC Contact Network and subsequently submitted to the Board of Regulators (BoR) for approval during Plenary 2. Following is adoption by the BoR, BEREC plans to launch a public consultation to invite stakeholder feedback.

## 6<sup>th</sup> Meeting of Working Group 1 of the European Board for Digital Services

On the 6<sup>th</sup> May 2025, the MCA participated in the 6<sup>th</sup> online meeting of Working Group 1 (Horizontal and legal issues). The meeting discussed the concept of relevant service and provider under the DSA, legal issues related to cross-border intermediary services, as well as exchanged views on what could constitute minor and purely ancillary features.

## 9<sup>th</sup> Meeting of Working Group 4 of the European Board for Digital Services

The MCA participated in the 9<sup>th</sup> online meeting of WG4 (Integrity of the Information Space) of the European Board for Digital Services on the 5<sup>th</sup> May 2025. The meeting focused on upcoming national elections, future development of the DSA Elections Toolkit, and WG4's input to the Article 35(2) report under the DSA.

## Open Day organised by the Directorate of Lifelong Learning

The Malta Communications Authority (MCA) took part in an Open Day organised by the Directorate of Lifelong Learning, where representatives Alistair Farrugia and Denise Borda delivered an interactive session titled "Combating ECS-Based Scams and Illegal Content Online." The session focused on the evolving nature of scams and illegal online content, offering practical guidance on how individuals can identify and respond to such threats. Participants showed strong interest in the topic, actively engaging with the speakers and asking insightful questions, making the session a rewarding experience for all involved. Part of our on-going work at the MCA is to monitor public sector websites on a continuous basis in order to ensure that these are accessible to all. Therefore, contributing to such discussions reinforces our commitment to building a more inclusive digital environment for everyone.

Administrative Review Tribunal – Maltapost plc versus L-Awtoritá ta' Malta dwar il-Komunikazzjoni 13<sup>th</sup> & 19<sup>th</sup> May 2025:

Two sittings before the Administrative Review Tribunal in the case Maltapost plc versus L-Awtoritá ta' Malta dwar il-Komunikazzjoni, where Maltapost are contesting a MCA decision requiring Maltapost to pay compensation for not having achieving the quality of service targets for 2019. Case was adjourned to 23<sup>rd</sup> October 2025, for Tribunal's decision – MCA were given until 19<sup>th</sup> August 2025, to submit its final written submissions in response to those made by Maltapost.
