Web Accessibility

"As from September 2018, all <u>public sector websites</u> need to conform to the new European accessibility directive. The directive ensures that all <u>public sector organisations'</u> websites and apps are accessible, using existing accessibility standards."





Web Accessibility

- The Directive sets forward a minimum base standard for compliance, monitoring, and evaluation across Europe. The MCA has been assigned as the entity responsible to implement this directive.
- MCA is coordinating with FITA and CRPD to ensure effectiveness of implementation.
- FITA will carry out the in-depth assessments under the MCA's guidance.
- CRPD will provide feedback mechanism "to enable any person to notify the MCA of any failures of a website to comply with the accessibility requirements."



WCAG Levels

- Web Accessibility makes the web easier to use for a wider audience not just persons with disabilities
- The Directive is based on EN 301 549 which was updated to adopt the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) 2.1
- WCAG 2.1 is split across three conformance levels
 - Level A Minimal impact on design
 - Level AA Some impact on design
 - Level AAA High impact on design





Monitoring and Reporting

- Simplified Assessments
 - Use of automated tools
 - Manned assessment of key web pages / screens



- In-Depth Assessments
 - Manned verification of a complete user journey following a typical default sequence
 - Manned evaluation of interaction with forms, interface controls, dialogue boxes, data confirmations, error messages



WAD Accessibility Statement

- As from September 2019, all websites shall have an Accessibility Statement (as per Implementing Decision (EU) 2018 / 1523 for Accessibility Statement model).
- Accessibility statement shall be accessible and machine readable.
- Statement shall be accessible and reachable from all website pages e.g. in the footer.




WAD Accessibility Statement Contents

Contents of Accessibility Statement shall include as a minimum

- Title: Accessibility Statement
 - A short statement outlining the organisation's commitment to website and mobile app accessibility
- Compliance status
 - Fully compliant OR
 - Partially compliant OR
 - Not compliant
- Overview on non-accessible with a reason/s
 - Non-compliance with national legislation
 - Disproportionate burden
 - Content is not in-scope of the applicable legislation
- Statement outlining the date of preparation / update of the Accessibility Statement –
 statement to be updated at least twice a year
- A link to the organisation's contact point to direct queries related to accessibility
- A link to the MCA's Web Accessibility Enforcement form i.e. www.mca.org.mt/accessibilitycomplaint and to the CRPD

- Objective → all Public Sector websites achieve WCAG Level
 AA
- Assessment of website at Simplified and In-Depth levels
- Deliverable → Report with findings and recommendations
- MCA will present national report to EC outlining position of MS vis-à-vis status of accessibility of public sector websites





- Total Public Sector Websites (to date) → > 650
- Amount of sites to monitor dependent on population
